REPORTS

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As President of Golf Manitoba, I'm pleased to report on our activities this past year.

We had abnormal weather this year. May and June were much wetter than normal resulting in extensive flooding, especially in Western Manitoba, and then below normal precipitation in July, August and September.

Our tournaments were played as scheduled under generally ideal conditions. However, the Nott AutoCorp Men's Amateur scheduled for Neepawa was moved, due to wet conditions, to the Portage Golf Club. I want to extend appreciation to the golf courses who hosted our tournaments and to the volunteers who helped make them a success.

I also want to extend appreciation to the players who participated and congratulations to the provincial champions, namely:

Special recognition goes to those players who represented Manitoba on a provincial team in a Canadian Championship.

The Canadian Men's Amateur was played at Niakwa and Elmhurst August 9 to 14, 2011 with 240 golfers for the first 2 days after which the field was cut to the low 70 and ties which included Todd Fanning, Scott Markham and Adrian Kibsey.

There were a number of changes and initiatives this year:

- (1) Provincial Teams were reduced from 4 to 3 players, with 2 of the 3 best scores counting towards the team standings for the first 2 days of play.
- (2) Increased emphasis was put on Player Development with Juniors who participated in the Western Canada Summer Games in Kamloops August 12-14, 2011. The training program started at the Golf Dome during the winter with 22 boys and girls under 16 and resulted in 4 boys and 4 girls being selected to represent Manitoba. This program is to continue in preparation for the Manitoba Games in Swan River in 2012 and the Canada Summer Games in Quebec in 2013.
- (3) The Golf in Schools program for children in elementary grades continues to grow with some 60 schools enrolled in Manitoba. While there is a one time cost of \$475.00 for equipment, this program introduces children to golf which can be a game for a life time. Details are on the Golf Canada web site.
- (4) Golf Manitoba in conjunction with the National Allied Golf Association held a Golf Awareness Day on May 3, 2011 to create awareness among Manitoba MLA's about golf's positive impact on the economy, the environmental stewardship practices and the health and wellness benefits from the sport.
- (5) Golf Canada Western regional rep, Blair Armitage, and Dave Comaskey met with executives from a number of golf clubs to inform them about member benefits and services as well as listen to feedback on how we can further assist. This Club Visitation program will continue.

The continuing success of Golf Manitoba programs is heavily dependent upon our dedicated volunteers who faithfully give their time and efforts. Thanks for your help and congratulations to those who have achieved 5, 10, 15, 20 and 25+ years of service this year. Congratulations to the Distinguished Service Award winner.

Golf Manitoba administers the Manitoba Golf Scholarship Fund, a registered charity with the goal of providing financial assistance to young golfers pursuing post secondary education in Canada. I want to extend congratulations to the 2011 winners: Lucas Wazney from Elmhurst, Bruce Barr from Southwood, Alex Crawford from Breezy Bend, Brodie Gobin from Portage, Mindy Lichtman from St Boniface, Joey Ringaert from Niakwa, Bobby Wiebe from Pine Ridge and Troy Woods from South Interlake.

Golf Manitoba, along with the Professional Golfers Association (PGA) of Manitoba and the Manitoba Golf Superintendents Association operate the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame and Museum. Congratulations to this year's inductees, namely: Derek Ingram, Gary Kullman, Judi Lidstone and Walter Perchaylo.

I want to extend personal thanks to Golf Manitoba Board members for their time and dedication this past year. Special thanks to committee chairs and their members for your efforts and guidance in special areas of our operations. Please read their reports for details of their activities.

For the last 3 years, I have represented Golf Manitoba on the Golf Canada Provincial Council, a national committee that is involved in governance, strategic and policy issues which may impact provincial golf association and to provide input on matters to the Board of Directors. I am pleased to be re-elected to represent Golf Manitoba on this committee.

I am also a member of the Golf Canada Governance Committee, dealing with regulatory and structural aspects of the Board and its operation.

I want to express my appreciation to the Golf Manitoba staff, including Dave Comaskey, John Lamarche, Garth Goodbrandson, Lisa Andersen and Carol Muzychka and the summer interns for their work and assistance this past year.

In conclusion, I want to say that while we evaluate our programs annually we appreciate suggestions, especially from players, regarding our tournaments and other activities

For example, this year, on a trial basis, we allowed the use of a power cart in all events, except the juniors. We will be reviewing this policy during the winter and would appreciate feed back from players. Please feel free to contact us at any time.

COURSE RATING & HANDICAP COMMITTEE REPORT

To maintain valid course and slope ratings, golf courses are required to be re-rated at least every 10 years or when significant changes are made.

A total of 27 course ratings have been completed in 2011. These ratings included one new golf course, some with changes, as well as the scheduled re-ratings.

Women's ratings have been completed for Breezy Bend, Bridges, Carman, Chapples, Clear Lake, John Blumberg, Kingswood, Melita, Miami, Neepawa, Riverview, Rossmere, Sandy Hook and Southwood.

Men's ratings have been completed for Breezy Bend, Bridges, Carman, Clear Lake, John Blumberg, Kingswood, Melita, Miami, Neepawa, Riverview, Rossmere, Sandy Hook and Southwood.

Golf Manitoba continues to conduct Handicap Education Seminars for representatives from our member clubs. In 2011, a provincial seminar was held at The Elmhurst Golf & Country Club in April. We also conducted a club seminar for the Clear Lake Ladies Golf Club. To date, we have had representatives from 68 clubs and approximately 200 people attend these seminars. The license agreement with the USGA requires that each club have at least one representative certified. These representatives will then be used as a resource for inquiries at the club level. If your club has not sent an individual, please do so and if you have already sent someone, we would encourage you to send others to be educated on the details of the handicap system. We would also encourage clubs to organize seminars specifically for your members and Golf Manitoba will come to your club to assist.

Thank you to all our volunteers for their efforts throughout the year. Looking forward to another busy summer for all our men's and women's rating teams next year as well as continuing to educate Manitoba and North West Ontario golfers on the parameters of the handicap system.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT

The strength of any organization is in its membership. Unfortunately, membership in Golf Manitoba decreased from 2010 to 2011, from 15,003 members to approximately 13,500 members. This is due to a poor spring season, flooding in certain areas and less people are joining golf clubs.

Our club visitation program continues to be a priority with Dave Comaskey (Executive Director of Golf Manitoba) and Blair Armitage (Golf Canada's Regional Director of Membership Development for Western Canada) visiting between 15 and 20 clubs this past year to discuss membership. Visiting clubs – non-members and members – is critical to our continued success, and we will continue to do so.

Golf Manitoba and Golf Canada / RCGA programs and services are available to members who pay annual dues. There was no change in dues in 2011. The combined Golf Manitoba and Golf Canada / RCGA dues, including GST are:

Men and Women	\$22.05
Junior Men and Women	\$15.23

These dues provide members with a number of programs and services including:

1. Course and Slope Rating

Courses are rated on a 10 year cycle with new courses rated every 3 years until they are 10 years old. These ratings are used to determine the relative difficulty of a golf course.

2. Handicap Factor

The course and slope rating are used to calculate the player's Handicap Factor which enables golfers to compete regardless of ability.

3. Handicap Network

Golf Canada offers an on-line member service to calculate handicap and track playing statistics. The member side of golfcanada.ca also provides a significant communication tool for individual golfers and clubs.

4. Rules of Golf

To keep members informed and up to date on the Rules of Golf, clinics are conducted by certified rules officials.

5. Player Development

A number of clinics/camps are conducted under the leadership of CPGA Golf Professional Garth Goodbrandson for golfers of different skill levels and for clubs who do not have a CPGA Golf Professional.

6. Golf in Schools Program

Launched in 2009 to grow the game of golf, schools can apply to become involved with this program. To date we have approximately 60 schools in Manitoba participating in the program.

7. Scholarships

The Manitoba Golf Scholarship Fund and the Golf Canada Foundation offer scholarships to students with demonstrated academic excellence, have participated in the golf community and are pursuing post secondary studies at a Canadian educational institution.

8. Fund Raising

Member clubs can apply to Golf Manitoba to provide 7 volunteers to work a 3 hour bingo at McPhillips Station Casino or Club Regent for a \$750 reward.

9. Golf Canada Golf Card

This card provides a number of benefits, including savings on hotel rates and industry products.

10. Information

To keep members informed, several publications and websites are available.

It has once again been a long and busy schedule of tournaments and rules clinics this year. The weather has been incredible and relatively bug free.

To those tournament officials on scene; Lisa and Lorne, many thanks to you for your assistance, patience and professionalism throughout the year. To the office staff (Carol, Garth, John, Rebecca and Mackenzie), thank you for your tireless work. Special thanks to Dave Comaskey for his leadership and help in the past year.

To those of you who marked courses and prepared Supplementary Local Rules for our events, my sincere thanks.

To my fellow committee members (Betty Grant, Lou Spado, Louise Daymond, Don MacDonald), I say thank you and I hope that we will continue to work together in the same co-operative manner.

We also continued rules clinics during the winter that were well attended by players and officials and potential officials. We took our winter clinics to the clubs (St. Boniface, Rossmere, Breezy Bend, and Glendale) this past winter and saw an increase in attendance primarily due to local members from each club. These clinics will be offered again in the coming winter and spring. There are rule changes in January 2011, so we hope for a larger turn out next year.

The Royal Canadian Golf Association (RCGA) has a program for developing Rules officials. Levels 1 through 4 have been developed to make it easier for someone to learn more about the Rules of Golf or even become a rules official. The progression is as follows:

1. Levels One and Two are offered on-line through the RCGA website.
2. Level 3 is conducted by the provincial golf associations. We held one in April at St. Boniface and once again it was open to anyone. Jim Gosman, George McLeod, John Lamarche and Tammy Gibson achieved Level 3 status in 2011.
3. Level 4 is the National clinic run by the RCGA.

A Level 4 rules clinic was held at Niakwa in May. Irv Benne, Don MacDonald and myself all were accredited for the next four years.

It goes without saying that the strength of Golf Manitoba, aside from the staff members, is in the volunteers, who readily give up their time to ensure that the golfers of Manitoba and North West Ontario have a positive, pleasant experience participating in our competitions.

Lastly, my thanks to those who participated in another successful season.

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

The 2011 Player Development Committee consisted of Rob MacDonald as Chair, Judi Lidstone, Garth Collings, Tammy Gibson, Ed Boge, Louise Daymond, Garth Goodbrandson, and Dave Comaskey.

Golf Manitoba's Player Development programs continue to grow with the focus on young players. Some programs are designed to expose children to the game in a fun and safe environment where others are implemented to the high performance junior players and assist them in preparing for national and international competitions.

The 2011 season was a record year for Golf Manitoba's Future Links and National Golf in Schools programs. Over 4700 children were exposed to the game by participating in almost 300 different camps or clinics. Golf Canada Intern, Mackenzie Prasek and CPGA Professional, Glen Sirkis were the key instructors of the program that was overseen by Garth Goodbrandson.

For the first time, golf was one of nineteen participating sports in the Western Canada Games in Kamloops, British Columbia. Garth Goodbrandson was the Coach of the team and Brenda Prystayko was the Team Manager. The Western Canada Games Training Squad's preparation for the Games began in December of 2010. Twenty two team members (11 boys and 11 girls) trained throughout the winter months with Garth Goodbrandson conducting weekly team practices at The Golf Dome as well as weekly fitness training sessions were led by Kate McKenzie and Dan Russell. Team members practiced regularly as they also received a membership at The Golf Dome. Thank you once again to Curtis Gray and The Golf Dome for their continued support.

The Western Canada Games Training Squad team members also gained valuable experience by participating in the Mundie Putter and Nassau Leagues. Golf Manitoba's Mundie Putter and Nassau teams consisted of fourteen girls and fifteen boys. Garth Goodbrandson was assisted by Ed Boge and conducted weekly practices for team members. Both teams had excellent seasons that were highlighted by the Girls Team winning the B Division for the first time.

The qualifying process for the Western Canada Games team was an eight round qualifier where the players used their top six scores. The team qualifying concluded at the 2011 Manitoba Junior Championship at Bel Acres. Winnie Hyun, Dana Todd, Jaclyn Albrechtsen and Hannah Diamond comprised the Girls Team while the Boys Team consisted of Darren Kelpin, Bryce Sholdice, Travis Fredborg and Peter Takis. Manitoba was well represented both on and off the golf course by these fine young individuals. The Boy's played some excellent golf over the week and finished in 4th place while the Girls took home a bronze medal and finished third. Winnie Hyun led the girl's team and finished in 5th place individually. The weeklong event without a doubt will be a lifelong memory for all involved in the program.

Golf Manitoba has now been involved with the Canada Games, the Western Canada Games and the Manitoba Games. The players who have participated in those events have benefited tremendously from their experience.

Even though the golf season is winding down planning is well underway for programming for the 2012 Manitoba Games and the 2013 Canada Games. It is definitely an exciting time to be a junior golfer in Manitoba.

TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

Mother Nature certainly served up some dandy surprises this year! Our season began with the all-too-familiar wet and cold climate, followed by some very damaging and devastating flooding. After such a dismal season start, we were blessed with a hot and very dry summer with the notable absence of mosquitoes! Rather than carrying umbrellas and mosquito repellent, we were hunting for shade and carrying water and wet towels!

This year, there were some changes to our Golf Manitoba competitions:

- The use of motorized golf carts in all competitions was permitted (except the Junior competitions).
- The Rural Men's Junior Championship and the Rural Men's Amateur / Senior Championship were combined.
- A reduced entrance fee was offered to participants this year for on-line registration.
- Golf Canada along with the 10 provincial golf associations announced a change to the format of the provincial team and national competition. Starting this year provincial teams consisted of 3 players vs. the previous 4 members with the best 2 scores of 3 counting at the national championships. In the past Golf Canada and Golf Manitoba covered the majority of the cost of traveling to the national championships. As of 2011 a subsidy of \$500 and some clothing is provided to team members. In brief summary, in the past, funding was made available from the federal government for the national championships and thus it was a cost sharing initiative. Currently, significant financial resources are being directed towards the long term player development. A full explanation of the financial changes can be found on both the Golf Manitoba and Golf Canada Websites.

Highlights of this golf season included:

- The Men's Amateur Championship.
For the third year running, we were very pleased and fortunate to have **Nott AutoCorp** as our Title sponsor for the Men's Amateur Championship. The Nott AutoCorp Men's Amateur Championship was scheduled to be played at the Neepawa Golf & Country Club but due to the unfortunate flooding that affected this beautiful course, the competition had to be relocated. Our thanks and appreciation is extended to the Portage Golf Club who successfully hosted the 2011 Nott AutoCorp Men's Amateur Championship. Thank you, also, to the Neepawa Golf & Country Club for their initial involvement and their determination to offer their best to this championship.
- Golf Manitoba has conducted 16 championships and 4 qualifiers this year. There were approximately 1102 participants in 2011 which is down from 1149 participants in 2010, and 1303 in 2009. It has been, and continues to be, a main objective of your tournament committee to increase participation in events by creating or modifying tournaments so all competitors can compete at their respective skill level.
- Again, this year, our Pace-of-Play program was evident at several events. As the name would suggest, the intent of this initiative is ensuring that tournaments are conducted with a comfortable and reasonable pace of play.
- Our tireless volunteers were present at all Golf Manitoba events filling approximately 340 positions throughout the year including rules officials, starters, scorers, timers, course markers, and score board markers. Our volunteers, clearly, make our events run like a well-oiled machine.
- Our online tournament administration system, **BlueGolf**, was again well used and successful in keeping players, friends, and family up to date with each of the events and scoring. There has been positive feedback about this system and the communication it offers, and I must say a thank you to our staff who is responsible for inputting all the data.

- Each year we reach out to our member clubs with requests to host Golf Manitoba events. To our host clubs, thank you for supporting competitive golf in Manitoba and Northwestern Ontario.
- The Canadian Men's Amateur Championship was conducted right here in Winnipeg at the **Niakwa Country Club** and the **Elmhurst Golf & Country Club**. Congratulations to these two fine facilities, the volunteers, and the participants on a job well done! Without question, it was a successful and exciting event.
- For the first time this year golf was a participating sport at the Western Canada Summer Games. Golf Manitoba invested in the training of 22 boys and girls in preparation for this event. Following competing in 8 competitive rounds including the Provincial Junior Championships, teams of 4 boys and 4 girls were chosen to compete in this event which was held in Kamloops B.C.

Last year's report posed the question: Why do people compete? Not surprisingly, the answers received are as diverse and complex as in the past. Perhaps we will not find the one answer nor will we offer the one 'perfect' tournament, but we will continue to work toward offering as many options as possible in order to increase the participation and the growth of golf. Your constructive comments and feedback are always appreciated.

My thanks to the 2011 tournament volunteer committee of Don Cook, Louise Daymond, Barry Hooke, Tammy Gibson and Bonnie Stephenson and to our staff members Dave Comaskey (Executive Director), Lisa Andersen (Director of Competitions), and Lorne How (Tournament Administrator) who work so tirelessly and enthusiastically. Your contributions to the continuing improvement of Golf Manitoba events is commendable.

TREASURER'S REPORT

In accordance with the by-laws of Golf Manitoba Inc., the audited financial statements for the year ended March 31, 2011 have been reviewed and approved by the Board of Directors and are included in this Annual Report to the members of Golf Manitoba.

For the year ended March 31, 2011 Golf Manitoba had a net loss of \$7,944 compared to a net profit of \$1,176 in 2010. Revenue from membership dues decreased by \$2,712 in 2011. This was due to a decrease in the number of members reported by existing member clubs. Membership fees for the year were not increased. Four additional golf clubs renewed their membership in 2011 due to the Visitation Program implemented in the spring of 2010. This program was a joint initiative of Golf Canada and Golf Manitoba.

Grants received from Sport Manitoba increased by \$6,150 which included various special grants and sport development grants. Some of these were offset by corresponding expenditures.

Revenue from tournament entry fees fell \$16,951 from \$129,150 in 2010 to \$112,199 in 2011. This is a result of significant decrease in tournament participation. In the 2010 golf season, there were 1,149 participants versus 1,303 participants in the 2009 golf season, which is a decrease of 154 participants.

Camp and clinic fees increased to \$20,380 in 2011 versus \$7,705 in 2010. This \$12,675 increase was for fees collected for the Western Canada Summer Games, Mundie Putter and Nassau Training Squads, and the National Team fee. This revenue increase is offset by additional expenses reflected in the "Program Management" and "Teams" expense categories.

Development Grants and Sponsorship for 2011 was \$58,225 compared to \$33,491 in 2010. This is an increase of \$24,734. Of this increase, \$20,000 was due to the change by Golf Canada for the subsidizing of National Championship participants. In prior years, Golf Canada paid a portion of provincial team expenses directly. In 2011, they instead provided the provinces with a grant of \$20,000 and the provinces were responsible for team expenses.

Administrative expenses continue to be well controlled with moderate increases in 2011. Total administrative expenses were \$162,689 in 2011 compared to \$158,069 last year.

Significant changes in expenses for Program Management (\$137,017 for 2011 versus \$125,045 in 2010) and for Teams (\$44,675 in 2011 versus \$27,244 in 2010) are offset by increases in Camp and Clinic Fee and Development Grants, as discussed in the revenue section above.

During the fiscal year 2011, Golf Manitoba purchased \$9,606 in capital assets. These expenditures were primarily for computer hardware and software and office furnishings. This completes the costs required to set up Golf Manitoba's new office in the Sport Manitoba building. Obsolete and fully depreciated capital assets with an original cost of \$16,200 were disposed of.

GOLF CANADA PROVINCIAL COUNCIL REPORT

The 12 member Provincial Council consists of an appointee from each Provincial Golf Association, a chair person and a Golf Canada staff member.

The Mandate of the Provincial Council is: "As the interface between Golf Canada and the Provincial Golf Associations, the Provincial Council shall review key governance, strategic and policy issues and communicate any such issues to the Golf Canada Board of Directors that may impact the working relationship between Golf Canada and the Provincial Golf Associations."

This past year we had two in person meetings and three conference call meetings.

Our focus for the next year will be on:

1) Improving Communications

The Provincial Golf Associations and Golf Canada share the same goal, namely To Grow the Game of Golf. To help us achieve this goal we are sharing our successful activities and discussing our challenges. To measure results, we have adopted a set of weighted Key Performance Indicators.

2) Club Visitation/ Membership Strategy

Two years ago Golf Canada initiated a club visitation/membership drive to create awareness about the purpose and value of a Golf Manitoba/Golf Canada membership. Blair Armitage, Golf Canada Regional Director of Membership for Western Canada and Dave Comaskey, Golf Manitoba Executive Director have visited a number of golf clubs. This program will be continuing as it has been generally well received and successful.

3) Financial Sustainability

While the Provincial Golf Associations and Golf Canada rely heavily on volunteers to run their programs, there are increasing expenses associated with their operations. Hence we rely on membership dues, sponsorships, grants and fund raising activities to finance our operations. We need to create more awareness about our activities and the value for a golf membership. There are about 282,000 golfers in Manitoba but only about 15,000 Golf Manitoba members.

This is a challenging and exciting time to be involved with the golf industry and its impact on the economy. The National Allied Golf Association estimates that Manitoba's golf industry contributes over \$450 million towards Manitoba's Gross Domestic Product and there are some 18,000 employed in the industry across the province.

I look forward to my role as the Golf Manitoba delegate on Provincial Council next year and the value and benefits from the ideas generated.

MANITOBA GOLF SCHOLARSHIP FUND REPORT

The Fund's mandate is to provide scholarships to young golfers for the advancement and furtherance of their education at a Canadian post-secondary educational institution through the receipt, investment, accumulation and disbursement of funds for that purpose.

The Manitoba Golf Scholarship Fund's policy is to build our capital through contributions received and to provide annual scholarships from the interest earned on the accumulated capital. The Fund has increased from the initial capital of \$6,000 to a current balance exceeding \$150,000. The Fund's capital continues to grow, based upon the generosity of golf club and individual donors.

During the current year, due to the generosity of Dr. Daya Gupta's contribution of \$10,000 in 2006 and combined with earnings from the capital base, the Fund awarded a total of \$8,500 to the following individuals:

Lucas Wazney of Elmhurst was named the winner of the \$1,500 Dr. Daya Gupta Award for Outstanding Scholastic Achievement. The civil engineering student at the University of Manitoba had the highest academic standing of all applicants.

The seven winners of \$1,000 scholarships were:

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Golf Manitoba had a number of successes in 2011 which included a record number of children being introduced to the game through the Future Links and National Golf in Schools programs, a healthy competitive season which produced talented provincial champions, strong finishes at national championships (Myles Sullivan of the Portage GC finished sixth at the Canadian Junior and Teale Merkeley of Southwood finished 12th at the National Mid-Amateur), continued exposure and awareness of our new brand and successfully communicating to our politicians the benefit of our sport through the Manitoba Allied Golf Association Golf Awareness Day at the Manitoba Legislature.

Golf Manitoba continues to put significant focus and resources on longer term training of our athletes and we were fortunate this year to participate for the first time in the Western Canada Games. Twenty two young athletes (11 boys and 11 girls) under the age of 16 trained with Golf Manitoba's Director of Player Development for nine months preparing for the Games experience. As we evolve in the "Games" world, we are able to learn from our experiences and the success of the 2009 Canada Games Training Squad. The preparation for these Games proved to be extremely beneficial for our Western Canada Games Training Squad. Four girls and four boys qualified for the team based on 8 competitive rounds over the summer. The Squad represented Manitoba very well and we have now gained another experience to assist with building similar programs for the future.

Golf will be a participating sport in the 2012 Manitoba Summer Games and the next Canada Games are in 2013. We have structured the "Games Training Squads" to provide a progressive development opportunity for our young athletes. For the first time in 2012, we will hire Regional Coaches around the province to assist us in implementing regional training squads for the Games in August. This initiative will be a first for our Association and assist with the development of golf throughout the entire province.

Golf Manitoba and our partner national organization, Golf Canada have made visiting golf clubs more of a priority now than ever. The intent of our club visits is to ensure that all clubs are aware of the initiatives we are conducting as well as to listen to the feedback that staff and board members at clubs have on what we can do to assist them and the golf industry. As an example, we travelled to northern Manitoba this past September to visit six different clubs. Their needs have been heard and we are working on ways to build on the relationship we have.

The game of golf in Manitoba is continuing to evolve in a positive manner. We are seeing less people joining golf clubs but more people are playing the game. We are introducing the game to more young people which will benefit us all in the future. We are providing long term training to our top athletes which is starting to provide results and we are building on relationships with clubs and golfers which assist in developing the game within the entire province.

Thank you to all of you who assist Golf Manitoba in achieving our goals. Whether you volunteer for a tournament, assist at a bingo, rate courses, sit on a committee or the Board of Directors, communicate Golf Manitoba initiatives at your club or strive for perfection on the golf course, I appreciate your passion for this game. That passion is what makes golf as popular and healthy as it is.

Lastly, the Golf Manitoba staff are some of the most professional people I have ever dealt with. They are a pleasure to work with everyday and they have the passion that assists with driving our Association goals. I am thankful for their efforts.

1. DESCRIPTION OF ORGANIZATION

Golf Manitoba Inc. (the "organization") is a non-profit organization established to develop, promote, govern and service the game of golf in Manitoba and North West Ontario for the benefit of all participants.

The organization is exempt from taxation as a non-profit entity under Section 149(1)(l) of the Income Tax Act.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles. Because a precise determination of many assets and liabilities is dependent upon future events, the preparation of financial statements for a period necessarily involves the use of estimates which have been made using careful judgement. The financial statements have, in management's opinion, been properly prepared within the reasonable limits of materiality and within the framework of the significant accounting policies summarized below:

Financial instruments

The organization has elected to apply Section 3861, Financial Instruments - Disclosure and Presentation in place of Sections 3862 and 3863 of the CICA Handbook.

The organization classifies its financial instruments into one of the following categories based on the purpose for which the asset was acquired or liability incurred. The organization's accounting policy for each category is as follows:

Assets held-for-trading

Financial instruments classified as assets held-for-trading are reported at fair value at each balance sheet date, and any change in fair value is recognized in excess (deficiency) of revenue over expenses in the period during which the change occurs. Transaction costs are expensed when incurred.

In these financial statements, cash and cash equivalents and investments have been classified as held-for-trading.

Available-for-sale investments

Financial instruments classified as available-for-sale are reported at fair value at each balance sheet date, and any change in fair value is recognized in net assets in the period in which the change occurs. All transactions related to marketable securities are recorded on a settlement date basis.

In these financial statements, nothing has been classified as available-for-sale.

Held-to-maturity investments

Financial instruments classified as held-to-maturity are financial assets with fixed or determinable payments and fixed maturities that the organizations's management has the positive intention and ability to hold to maturity. These assets are initially recorded at fair value and subsequently carried at amortized cost, using the effective interest rate method. Transaction costs are included in the amount initially recognized.

In these financial statements, nothing has been classified as held-to-maturity.

Loans and receivables and other financial liabilities

Financial instruments classified as loans and receivables and other financial liabilities are carried at amortized cost using the effective interest method. Transaction costs are expensed when incurred.

In these financial statements, accounts receivable have been classified as loans and receivables. Accounts payable and accrued liabilities have been classified as other financial liabilities.

Capital management

Capital is comprised of the organization's net asset balances. The organization's objectives when managing capital are to continue as a going concern to protect its ability to meet its on-going liabilities, and carry out its objectives as outlined in note 1. The organization's management prepares a annual budget, allocating expenses in relation to anticipated funding its expects to receive for unrestricted operations.

Capital assets

Capital assets are stated at cost less accumulated amortization. Capital assets are amortized over their estimated useful lives at the following rates and methods:

Computer software	25%	straight-line method
Office equipment	25%	straight-line method
Office furniture	10%	straight-line method
Tournament equipment	25%	straight-line method

The organization regularly reviews its capital assets to eliminate obsolete items.

Capital assets acquired during the year but not placed into use are not amortized until they are placed into use.

Revenue recognition

The organization follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Externally restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are recognized. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured.

The remainder of the revenue is recognized when earned. The revenue is earned when the event has taken place.

Donated services

A large number of volunteers donate significant amounts of their time to program events and fundraising activities. No amount has been reflected in the financial statements for donated services since an objective basis is not available to measure the value of such services.

Allocation of salaries and wages and office expenses

The organization allocates salary and wage, and office expenses to three functional areas: administration, program management and tournament. The percentages are based upon estimates of staff time and resources spent for each area. These percentages are reviewed every year to determine whether there has been any significant shift which might warrant a change to the allocations. For the past six years the organization has not changed the allocation. The organization reviewed this allocation during the annual staff planning session conducted in the fall of 2010 given the change in the Sport Manitoba budget process for 2010/11 from Directed Funding to Sport Development Funding and changed the allocation as follows:

The organization prepares its financial statements in accordance with Canadian GAAP as defined by Canada's Accounting Standards Board (AcSB). The AcSB issued an exposure draft in March 2010 titled "Accounting Standards for Not-for-Profit Organizations". It is anticipated that these standards will be applicable for year ends beginning on or after January 1, 2012. Earlier application is permitted.

3. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

Credit Risk

Credit risk arises from the potential that a counter party will fail to perform its obligations. The organization is exposed to credit risk from funding, members and users. Due to the nature of the organization and its history with contributors, management assess the credit risk as low.

Fair Value

The organization's carrying value of cash and cash equivalents, investments, accounts receivable, and accounts payable and accrued liabilities approximates its fair value due to the immediate or short term maturity of these instruments.

Interest Rate

Interest rate risk is the risk that the value of a financial instrument might be adversely affected by a change in the interest rates. In seeking to minimize the risks from interest rate fluctuations, the organization manages exposure through its normal operating and financing activities. The organization is exposed to interest rate risk primarily through its investments and banking agreements.

5. LINE OF CREDIT

The organization has a \$10,000 line of credit with the Assiniboine Credit Union bearing interest at prime plus 1% and is secured by a general security agreement providing a fixed charge over all assets. The organization has not utilized the line of credit as at March 31, 2011.

6. INTERNALLY RESTRICTED

Net assets in the amount of \$100,000, which were contributed by MGA in 2003, have been internally restricted by the Board of Directors for major future capital acquisitions. Future appropriations will be made, of funds considered surplus to ongoing operations, on an annual basis upon approval by the Board of Directors.

7. NON-CONSOLIDATION OF CONTROLLED ENTITY

At November 30, 2010, the organization is the sole member of the Manitoba Golf Scholarship Fund Inc. (the "Fund"). The purpose of the Fund is to provide financial assistance to young golfers for the purpose of enabling them to further their education at a post-secondary educational institution. The Fund is incorporated under the Corporations Act of Manitoba and is a registered charity under the Income Tax Act. The Fund has not been consolidated in the organization's financial statements. Included in the organization's program management expenses are operating grants of \$1,084 (2010 - \$1,073) to the Hall of Fame.
